As part of our ongoing Andy's Man Club campaign; a charity which focuses supporting men's mental health, our Sixth Form students participated in a relay race on the school's running track.

Tackling 60km per form group, students worked together, moving to raise awareness of men's mental health. Some students ran, whilst others opted for a quick walk, doing an average of six laps each. Combining teamwork and adding a tangible representation of the 60 men lost to suicide globally each year, each lap was symbolic.

Students also wore fancy dress, donning stick on 'mo's' for the day, or growing their own! The moustache is a visual acknowledgement of the need to think about better men's mental health and the need to talk.


### LIFE SKILLS & WELLBEING PARENT EVENING
